‘Priest’s Martyrdom a Warning to the West’

On Tuesday July 26, the feast day of St James, less than two weeks after a rampaging Islamic terrorist killed 84 civilians with a truck in the south of France, Fr. Jacques Hamel was celebrating Mass in a quiet Normandy church in Sainte-Etienne-du-Rouvray. Two ISIS militants burst through the doors and forced the 86-year-old priest to his knees. They stabbed him in the chest and slit his throat while shouting *Allahu akbar*, (God is Great). Though their cries do not proclaim the greatness of the true God, they do proclaim a great warning to the West. The threat of militant Islam is come again, as it has in ages past, and it is sounding a warning to the Western nations to cling to the God of life and love in the face of death and hatred...

It is a terrible truth that jihadists are willing to die for their religion. It is an even more terrible truth that Westerners barely have a religion to live or die for. There can be no confidence in comatosed lethargy, contentious communities, concentrated materialism, or collective atheism. In the wake of the Nice

“Fr. Connor Danstrom... poses the idea that atheism is most rampant in cities because everything a person encounters there is created and rarely natural. During his time fighting forest fires in Northern California, Fr. Danstrom, (a former Fireman), noticed that those surrounded by natural beauty rarely espoused the atheistic worldview: With all that beauty around you, I never ran into an atheist. I ran into a lot of unchurched people who didn’t know what they believed about God, but if you pressed them ... they knew they didn’t make that beauty. It’s in the urban center, where everything is man-made, where we think we made the world. The urban, anti-transcendent attitude, as a result, tends to give people an impression that everything valuable *must* be created and innovated. But when one gets outside their normal purview - taking in Montana’s glaciers, the myriad of stars in the rural night sky, or the vastness of an ocean - it’s easy to see that humanity has, in fact, created very little.” **(Godlessness of Cultural Uniformity – Matthew Sewell)**

The Eucharist


The bread used during Mass is called "the host", coming from the Latin word "Hostia", meaning "victim".

The Host is placed on the paten and is elevated and offered to the Father by Jesus.

The priest pours wine into the Chalice and adds a drop of water. The wine stands for Christ and the water for humanity. The image here is that our humanity is totally immersed in Christ's divinity. We are truly in Christ. The Priest invites those assembled to offer this sacrifice, the sacrifice of Christ on the cross with all of their own sacrifices, pain and hurt. Then the climax of the Mass, Christ takes our seemingly worthless gifts and through the words of the Priest the Holy Spirit unites our gifts with the gift of Jesus Himself to God.

This makes each Mass, even with defective participation or homily infinitely meritorious before God.
